

THIS INSTRUMENT is hereby entered into this _____ day of _______, 2017, ("<u>Effective Date</u>") by and between CITY OF UNION GAP, a Washington municipal corporation, ("<u>Union Gap</u>"), CLARY UNION GAP, LLC, a Washington limited liability company and JAMES E. CLARY, Trustee of the JAMES E. CLARY TRUST, U/T/A dated December 18, 2014, (collectively "<u>Clary</u>").

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT. The term "<u>Development Agreement</u>," when used in this instrument, means that certain Development Agreement recorded on April 7, 2010, under Yakima County Auditor's File No. 7687575 and the below-described First Amendment.

FIRST AMENDMENT. The term "*First Amendment*," when used in this instrument, means that certain Amendment to Development Agreement, recorded March 2, 2015, under Yakima County Auditor's File No. 7865745.

MIN-TIE PROPERTY. The term "<u>Min-Tie Property</u>," when used in this instrument, means the Yakima County, Washington real property described on attached <u>Exhibit A</u>, which is owned by Min-Tie Marina, Inc., a Washington corporation and commonly referred to as Yakima County Assessor's Parcel Nos. 191331-31044 and 191331-34001.

AGREEMENT. FOR THE PURPOSE OF CLEARING TITLE TO THE MIN-TIE PROPERTY AND CONFIRMING OBLIGATIONS ARISING FROM THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT, THE UNDERSIGNED PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. **AMENDMENT.** The Development Agreement is amended to clarify that the Min-Tie Property and its owners are not obligated to perform any of the terms, conditions, and requirements of the Development Agreement. The First Amendment removed and released two properties from Exhibit C of the Development Agreement. This Second Amendment is for the purpose of confirming that the Min-Tie Property and its owners are not parties to or bound by the Development Agreement. Union Gap and Clary confirm that all obligations set forth in Development Agreement as between those parties remain in full force and effect including but not limited to the obligations set forth in Development Agreement ¶3.
- 2. **RELEASE OF MIN-TIE PROPERTY.** The undersigned parties hereby acknowledge that the existing and future owners of the Min-Tie Property have no obligations under the Development Agreement. For the avoidance of doubt, it is hereby expressly acknowledged that Sections 3(e) and 3(f) of the Development Agreement relate solely to contractual obligations between Union Gap and Clary.
- 3. **BINDING EFFECT; COVENANTS RUNNING WITH THE LAND.** The provisions of this instrument are binding on the undersigned parties and their respective heirs, successors, or assigns and constitute covenants appurtenant to and running with the land.
- 4. **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT**. EXCEPT as specifically amended herein or in the First Amendment, the Development Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as if fully set forth herein.

5. **GENERAL TERMS.**

- 5.1 Governing Law And Venue. This instrument was made under the laws of the state of Washington, and if it becomes necessary to interpret or enforce any of this instrument's terms, the laws of the state of Washington will apply. The proper and exclusive venue for any proceeding to interpret or enforce this instrument will be Yakima County, Washington.
- 5.2 <u>Headings.</u> The captions and paragraph headings used in this instrument are inserted for convenience of reference only and are not intended to define, limit, or affect the interpretation or construction of any term or provision of this instrument.
- 5.3 Attorney Fees. If any party to this instrument brings a legal action to interpret or enforce this instrument, the substantially prevailing party in the action will be entitled to an award of the reasonable attorney fees and costs the party incurs in the action, whether in mediation, arbitration, at trial, on appeal, or in a bankruptcy proceeding.

- 5.4 **Entire Agreement.** This instrument constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the parties to this instrument with respect to its subject matters.
- 5.5 <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in any number of identical counterparts, with each counterpart having the same effect as if all parties to this Agreement had signed the same document. All executed counterparts of this Agreement will be construed as and constitute one and the same instrument.

WHEREAS, The City of Wapato owns and operates jail facilities which it can make available to the City for incarceration of City prisoners;

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions for an agreement between the City of Union Gap and the City of Wapato for the incarceration of prisoners can be accomplished through interlocal agreement pursuant to RCW 39.34;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNION GAP, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES as follows:

The City Manager is authorized to sign an Interlocal Corrections / Detention Agreement with the City of Wapato.

INTERLOCAL CORRECTION/DETENTION AGREEMENT

This Interlocal Correction/Detention Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered by and between the City of Union Gap (hereinafter "Union Gap"), a Washington municipal corporation, and the City of Wapato (hereinafter "Wapato") a Washington municipal corporation (Union Gap and Wapato collectively the "Parties").

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intent of Union Gap to utilize the detention facilities maintained by Wapato, and to compensate Wapato therefore, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, for the care and custody of jail prisoners of Union Gap arrested and/or detained for violations of applicable law within the City of Union Gap for which incarceration is authorized.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms and conditions herein, Wapato desires to receive payment in return for making its jail facilities available for Union Gap and provide for the care and custody of Union Gap prisoners who were arrested and/ or detained for violations of applicable law within the City of Union Gap for which incarceration is authorized.

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into by and between the Parties pursuant to Chapters 39.34 and 70.48 of the Revised Code of Washington, which provides for interlocal agreements for hiring and sharing of correction/detention facilities between local governments.

II. AGREEMENT

Therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and promises herein, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2017, and terminate on July 1, 2019, unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with Section 13 of this Agreement.
- 2. Incarceration. Wapato shall accept and incarcerate a minimum of twenty (20) Union Gap's prisoners that are eighteen (18) years and older, were arrested or convicted of misdemeanor(s) and/or gross misdemeanor(s), and who were arrested by Union Gap police officers or convicted in Union Gap Municipal Court for a violation of applicable law within the City of Union Gap. Of the twenty guaranteed beds, Union Gap is permitted to determine the number of male and/or female prisoners, subject to availability of bed space for female inmates. Union Gap is guaranteed the ability to house a minimum of five (5) female inmates at all times. Wapato shall feed and otherwise generally care for such prisoners in the same manner as its own prisoners. All prisoners incarcerated for Union Gap by Wapato shall be subject to all laws, rules and regulations of Wapato governing its jail facility, including Wapato's visitation rules and regulations. Wapato retains the right to refuse to incarcerate and/or provide any other services to Union Gap prisoners, who, as determined by Wapato, constitute a security risk or who's medical or mental health requirements exceed the capability of the

Wapato Municipal Jail to provide service. Wapato retains discretion to notify Union Gap that a prisoner is being denied access to the Wapato jail, or that a current prisoner must be removed from the Wapato jail. Wapato agrees to make a good faith effort to transport high risk or violent offenders to the Yakima County Jail after Wapato makes reasonable efforts to house the inmates. Such notice shall be made to the Union Gap Police Department by any effective means (whether in writing or verbally).

- a. Prisoners housed for Union Gap shall not be used for any outside work release program unless specifically approved by Union Gap, or they are escorted by Union Gap Police Officers or working with the Correctional staff of the Wapato City Jail. No other outsourcing of prisoners to other agencies or Cities shall be permitted.
- **Clothing and Bedding.** Wapato agrees to provide each Union Gap prisoner with necessary or appropriate clothing and to provide each such prisoner with a booking kit.
- **Booking & Release Procedures**. Union Gap prisoners shall be booked per the procedures and policies of Wapato. Prisoners' personal property shall be held by Wapato and be transported with each prisoner to the Wapato jail facility. Prisoners shall be released according to Wapato's procedures and policies, and in accordance with applicable court orders.
- **Prisoner Delivery and Notification**. Union Gap shall be responsible for transporting prisoners to the Wapato jail facilities. No person who appears to be sick or injured shall be accepted for incarceration in Wapato jail facilities until they have received proper medical attention. Wapato shall provide Union Gap with a monthly list of Union Gap prisoners housed during the billing month. This list will be included with each monthly billing statement. Wapato will notify the Chief of Police of Union Gap of their Adult Population (ADP) daily.
- 6. <u>Court Appearances</u>. Wapato will provide video conference access to prisoners with the Union Gap Municipal Court for court appearances, hearings or other proceedings as determined necessary by the Union Gap Municipal Court. In addition to providing access to video conferencing, Wapato will provide one Corrections Officer to transport and supervise prisoners while attending court appearances, hearings or other proceedings (excluding jury trials) for the Union Gap Municipal Court one day per week excluding Weekends and Mondays.
- a. Wapato will provide for a prisoner transport and supervision during a jury trial or for more than one day per week for the set fee set forth in section 7 below.
- b. Transport for court appearances, hearings or other proceedings may be available on Mondays, on a case-by-case basis only and at the option of Wapato based on staffing availability.
- **Compensation**. Union Gap agrees to pay Wapato the sum of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35) per day, per bed space, for Twenty (20) bed spaces for Union Gap prisoners incarcerated in Wapato jail facilities pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. On January 1, 2018 this price shall increase to Thirty-Eight Dollars and Fifty cents (\$38.50) per day for Twenty (20) bed

spaces. This shall include a guarantee of five (5) female bed spaces to be available for housing Union Gap prisoners.

- a. Union Gap prisoners in excess of the twenty (20) bed spaces may be housed on a space available basis. For prisoners in excess of the contracted twenty (20) bed spaces, Union Gap shall pay the sum of Forty Five Dollars (\$45.00) per day. This rate shall apply to a full day or any part of the day. The charges in this section shall apply without regard to whether the prisoner has been charged, tried, or sentenced and shall continue until Union Gap notifies Wapato that the prisoner is to be released or until the sentence has been served by the prisoner.
- b. For court transports as specified in section 6 above, Union Gap shall pay Wapato a base fee of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month during 2017. Beginning January 1, 2018 this fee shall be increased to One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) per month.
- c. For transport and standby at jury trials or for Court transports in excess of twice per week, Union Gap shall pay Wapato an additional fee of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) per occurrence.
- d. Itemized monthly bills shall be sent out by Wapato and paid by Union Gap within 30 days of mailing.

8. Medical Treatment.

- a. Wapato shall provide and furnish minor medical care, attention and treatment through a contracted in-house medical care provider to the same degree provided within the jail facility to its own prisoners. The cost of the contracted in-house medical services are included in the daily housing rate.
- b. Union Gap will reimburse Wapato for the costs of prescriptions, medical, dental, other health care services and transportation costs incurred on behalf of Union Gap inmates. However, a major medical treatment that is not a life-threatening emergency must be authorized in advance by Union Gap, except that necessary major medical treatment may be provided by Wapato if circumstances make it impossible or unfeasible to obtain advanced notice. In such cases, Union Gap shall be notified as soon as reasonably possible after the care is provided.
- c. Medical care for prisoners who are assaulted or accidently injury themselves while housed in the Wapato Jail facility is the responsibility of Wapato. If an inmate intentionally injuries themselves or instigates an action where they are injured the cost shall be paid by Union Gap.
- d. For medical care expenses which are a direct result or directly caused by misfeasance, or malfeasance of Wapato officers or agents shall be paid by Wapato. For medical expenses which are a direct result or directly caused by misfeasance, or malfeasance of Union Gap officers or agents shall be paid by Union Gap.

- **13.** <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, by providing the other party with thirty (30) days written notice of termination.

Leniency, delay or failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any agreement, covenant or condition of this Agreement, or to exercise any right herein given in any one or more instances, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of any such agreement, covenant, condition or right.

This Agreement sets forth all of the terms, conditions and agreements of the parties relative to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all such former agreements which are hereby declared terminated and of no further force and effect upon the execution and delivery hereof.
