Public Works/Community Development

Resolution No. – 17-34 – Set Public Hearing – Comprehensive Plan

Motion by Council Member Butler, second by Council Member Olson setting a public hearing to consider the updated Comprehensive Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

Award of Bid – VMB/Goodman Road Traffic Signal Project Motion by Council Member Matson, second by Council Member Olson to accept the most qualified, lowest responsible bidder, Granite Construction Co. of Yakima, Washington in the amount of \$459,109.00 for the VMB/Goodman Road Traffic Signal Project contingent on Mare's Pasture letter of agreement and Council agrees to wave road improvements planning & inspection fees. City Manager Report

City Manager Fisher complemented the Council on awarding the VMB/Goodman Road signal project; Old Town Days would feature the Civil War re-enactment followed by a fireworks display Saturday evening and complimented those involved in advertising and publication for the event; Chief Cobb was recently featured in a School Safety article; the City has paid off the Longfibre and Valley Mall Boulevard SIED loans; Union Gap was recently awarded Safe Routes to School funding in the amount of \$828,000; Fisher gave a quarterly Economic Development update for the months of March through June stating 85 permits have been issued with an estimated project valuation of \$7.1 million and \$98,000.00 has been collected in fees.
