




Thank You~ Rod Otterness

Friendly Reminder

When celebrating our Nation's Birthday don't forget that fireworks are illegal in Union Gap.



It is unlawful for any person to hold, conduct or engage in any public display for fireworks within the city without first having obtained and being in possession of a valid permit under the provisions of this chapter.



(Ord. 2344 § 1 (part), 2002)

Any person violating or failing to comply with the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as provided therefore. In addition, violations of this chapter shall constitute a civil infraction with a civil penalty of two hundred fifty dollars per occurrence. Infractions shall be initiated, and may be appealed, under the infraction rules for courts of limited jurisdiction for the Union Gap Municipal Court.

Water conservation: It all starts with you

Play your part, be water smart!

Wise Water Use

Get an Energy Star labeled washing machine. Wash only full loads.

Use low flow showerhead.

Use a shut-off nozzle on your hose.

Put faucet aerators on sink faucets.

Install new toilets that use less than 1.6 gallons per flush.

Turn off the water while soaping hands and brushing teeth.

Turn off sink faucet while scrubbing dishes and pots.

Use plants that require less water.

Water your yard and outdoor plants early or late in the day to reduce evaporation.

Take shorter showers - five minutes or less is best.

Mulch around plants to hold water in the soil.

Use a broom, not a hose, to clean driveways and walkways.

Water conservation, using water efficiently and avoiding waste, is essential to ensure that we have adequate water today and into the future. Water is a finite resource and the supplies on Earth today are no more than what was here at the beginning of the planet. It is up to all of us to use the water we have wisely, and it is as simple as each of us making small changes. Make conserving water a daily part of your life. And remember when you save water, you save energy and money!




WORK ZONE SAFETY

Report Streetlight Outages

- Pole/Light Number**
 - Location of Street Light**



Improving road conditions and expanding roads put workers in a potentially vulnerable situation. When driving please be attentive and follow work zone signs, cones, barrels, barriers, pavement markings and work trucks. Even if you don't see workers immediately that does not mean they are not out there. Please

stay alert; follow the work zone signs and other direction to keep workers and drivers/passengers safe. These workers could be your family, friends, the moms or dads of your child's friends, the people down the street or the baseball coach.

- Slow down, pay attention, stay calm
- Eliminate distractions
- Merge as soon as possible
- Expect delays, plan for them and leave early to reach your destination on time
