OLDE YAKIMA LETTERPRESS MUSEUM MOVES TO THE CENTRAL WASHINGTON AG MUSEUM



The Olde Yakima Letterpress Museum (OYLM) recently relocated to the Central Washington Ag Museum in Union Gap, from their original location on Landon Avenue in Union Gap.

Since the move, OYLM has seen an influx in patrons, including dozens of people coming every Saturday to print their own 'Wanted' poster with their name on it that they typeset themselves.

The Letterpress Museum is currently open two days per week, and by appointment. On Tuesdays, volunteers are trained on how to use the wide variety of printing equipment, and Saturdays are generally 'printing' days for projects such as the wanted posters. Free 'Wanted' posters will be available through October.

Only about 1/3 of the printing equipment the museum owns is currently on display, and they are expanding in the upcoming months to increase their exhibit space. Some of the items include 15 small letterpresses, 2 front pedal presses and an extensive type library with 100 cases of type (many of which are still being organized).

The goal of the Olde Letterpress Museum is to both showcase history, and to be educational. Young visitors are often amazed that some of the presses can work without electricity, and they are equally impressed at how complicated the process was to get ink printed on paper.

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SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

It is just about that time of year again! Snow and ice control...staff has evaluated the streets and travel routes throughout the city to determine the best methods possible of providing safe travel for you and your family. This might mean driving a few extra blocks to arrive at your destination safely. Our goal is to provide a safe driving experience during hazardous winter weather, and to create a path for you to meet your daily driving needs; even if it takes you a few extra blocks from your normal route of travel!

During the winter storm season our equipment operators work up to 12+ hours a shift to protect your family. Please remember to be courteous to our equipment operators; we are working to keep you and your family safe.

SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAYS

Residents are responsible to maintain sidewalks and driveways adjacent to their property. Please shovel snow into your yard, not into the street. If your sidewalk is icy you may correct the hazard by applying a heavy coating of sand. When a sidewalk is not clear, the results can be very hazardous for pedestrians & school children.

Pitch in and do your part to help keep your sidewalks and driveways hazard free! A helpful hint for resident on snow routes; if possible, do not clear the end of your driveway until the storm has stopped and the road is plowed from curb to curb. This will save you additional work and will lower your frustration level.

MLK SCHOOL SIDEWALK & SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

City has been notified that we have been selected to receive funding through the Safe Routes to School Program.

The project includes sidewalk, pathway, curb, gutter, extensions, ADA curb ramps, speed feedback signs, bike rack, bike lane, storm water drainage, signing, and crosswalks. Funding for the "Martin Luther King School Sidewalk and Safety Improvements" are as follows:

\$828,170	WSDOT 2017 Safe Routes to School Program
\$30,000	Martin Luther King School
\$21,000	City match

The estimated completion date is set for August 2018.

VMB / GOODMAN TRAFFIC SIGNAL

Granite Construction Company of Yakima began construction of intersection improvements at Valley Mall Blvd / Goodman Road.

The project includes ADA curb ramps, concrete sidewalk, traffic signals, storm drainage improvements, pavement markings, and related improvements. The project is funded through a \$387,685, Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvements (CMAQ) grant along with private and City contributions. Improvements are scheduled to be substantially completed by the end of September 2017.

VALLEY MALL BOULEVARD RESURFACING PROJECT

The City has received \$1,900,288 funding from Washington State Department of Transportation through the National Highway System (NHS) Asset Management Program for the Valley Mall Boulevard Resurfacing Project.

The project includes the grinding and overlay of Valley Mall Boulevard from Main Street to South Third Avenue. A local match of 13.5% is required from the City.

SOUTH 14TH STREET IMPROVEMENTS

After many years of trying, the City has finally become successful in receiving a Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) grant in the amount of \$1,439,224, along with City matching funds of \$358,181

The South 14th Street Improvements project includes curb, gutter, storm water drainage, signing, and crosswalks. The estimated completion date is set for October 2018.

CIVIC CENTER CONSTRUCTION

MH Construction of Kennewick was awarded the Union Gap Civic Campus (City Hall & Police Department) contract and began construction in August. The project site is bound by 1st & 2nd Street and West Franklin Street to the south and West Ahtanum Road to the north.

The project includes construction of an approximate 23,500 square foot new facility to house the operations of the City Hall and the Police Department. The project will consist of two phases - Phase 1 will be the construction of the new facility; Phase 2 will be the demolition of the Public Works and Community Development and Council Chamber structures at 3106 1st Street, 3103 2nd Street and 3105 2nd Street including the garage.

The project is funded through a USDA low interest loan of up to \$ 9.2 million. The estimated completion date is set for Sept. 2018.

PARK IMPROVEMENTS

AHTANUM YOUTH PARK - The City received a grant from the Recreation Committee for Outdoor (RCO) in the amount of \$160,000, the City in Partnership with Yakima Youth Soccer Association (YYSA) is matching the grant with \$160,000 of in-kind costs. The project consists of entrance improvements, three new grass soccer fields, one turf field, ADA parking and other Park improvements.

LOUDON PARK - The City has installed kite shades in the Park, check them out!!

CAHALAN SKATE PARK - Improvements are being made to finish the Skate Park built last fall in Cahalan Park, the Public Works Department is installing kite shades, benches, water fountain and finishing the landscaping.

FULLBRIGHT PARK - Replacement of the roof at the Central Washing Agricultural Museum office/ meeting building should start by the end of September, the existing roof began leaking this spring.
