FREE "Spring Clean-Up" - CITY OF UNION GAP

On Saturday, May 11, 2018, from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm, the City of Union Gap and Basin Disposal will be sponsoring the "Spring Clean-Up" program. There will be three (3) disposal sites, set-up throughout the City, for residents to dispose of their yard waste. The site locations are as follows:

- · City Hall parking lot @ 107 West Ahtanum Road; next to the Fire Station
- Ray's Wholesale Meats parking lot @ 2112 South 3rd Avenue
- Cahalan Park parking lot @ 2100 South 18th Street

This **FREE** service is for Union Gap residents only; you may be required to show proof of residence at the disposal sites. The disposal sites are for yard waste generated in Union Gap only; if your waste is bagged, you will be asked to remove the bags prior to dumping into the disposal containers.

SPRING HAS OFFICIALLY SPRUNG IN THE CITY OF UNION GAP!

As you and your loved ones are outside trimming trees, mowing yards, and planting flowers, here are a few friendly reminders to be mindful of. While fertilizers and sprays promote healthy plants and beautiful yards they are also full of chemicals that are not only harmful to yourself; but also to the Storm Water Quality Management Program (SWQMP). Stormwater is one of the leading causes of pollution in the United States.

Stormwater drains need to be kept clear of lawn clippings, leaves, and garbage. By keeping them clear you are limiting the chances of flooding in your yard and/or home. Stormwater drains are not processed like sewer systems. Stormwater drains flow directly into our riverbeds and local streams without a sanitization process.

By limiting the amount of fertilizer and/or the number of times you fertilize your yard, you can contribute to a safer environment for all. Over fertilizing promotes the growth of algae in creeks and other water resources. Algae can attract mosquitoes and other insects, also killing numerous fish per year. A great alternative to fertilizer is lawn mulch. One lawn mulching session is equivalent to one treatment of store bought fertilizer.

Everybody loves a clean car and by washing your car in your yard instead of your driveway or the City streets, the water, detergent, and dirt will be filtered by the soil in your lawn and naturally absorbed. A better solution is to take your car to a commercial carwash where the dirty water is sent to a wastewater treatment plant.

With your help we can work together to create a healthier environment by using the above-noted tips. Remember, we are the solution to stormwater pollution!


UPDATES TO COMPREHENSIVE PARK PLAN

The City of Union Gap is updating its Comprehensive Park Plan. This Plan serves as a management tool to guide the provision of parks and recreation services in the City. This plan is based on an assessment of current parks and recreation facility needs and future opportunities, and it incorporates the input received through a special community parks and recreation survey. As a result, the plan strives to balance a wide range of community interests with the City's financial realities and seeks to position the City to secure grant funds for priority park improvements and to target capital and operation spending strategically.

The Park Board has been reviewing different aspects of the Park Plan update during their meetings. The Park Board meets the 2nd Wednesday of every month @ 5:30 pm in the Union Gap Civic Campus Council Chambers located at 102 W. Ahtanum Rd. VALLEY MALL BOULEVARD RESURFACING PROJECT

A mile and a half between Main St. and S. 3rd Ave. will be resurfaced. The Project is scheduled to start April 1, 2019 and expected to last through May 2019. The project will start with minor improvements throughout Valley Mall Boulevard including sidewalk, asphalt, and median work. The project will be concluding with resurfacing of the entire roadway section. There will be road closure at times during the day and full road closure both directions between 9 P.M. and 6 A.M. WHO TO CALL FOR ASSISTANCE?

EMERGENCY - 24 HOURS A DAY / 7 DAYS A WEEK: All life threatening emergencies - dial 911

<u>AFTER NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS, WEEK-ENDS AND HOLIDAYS:</u> All non-life threatening emergencies (i.e. water line breaks / sewer back-ups) - dial **509.248.0430***

DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS: All issues that can wait until normal business hours - dial the appropriate number listed on the back of this newsletter.

*After normal business hours, week-ends, and holidays the Police Department transfers their business line to SUNCOMM Communications - the 911 call center for Yakima County and dispatch for the Union Gap and Yakima Police Departments. If you do not get an answer right away, there is a good chance 911 is handling calls on their emergency lines and are unable to get to the non-emergency lines as quickly as normal.





YAKIMA EMERGENCY ALERT PROGRAM

What is the Yakima Emergency Alert Program?

This service allows you to opt-in to receive notifications via phone calls, text messaging, e-mail and more based on locations you care about. You can choose to receive notifications about events that may affect your home, workplace, family's schools and more.

When will it be used?

This system will be used to notify you about imminent threats to health and safety as well as informational notifications that affect your locations or work environments. Administrators will send notifications regarding severe weather or other local emergencies via the notification methods you have specified.

Will I still get emergency notifications if I don't sign up?

If you don't create a username and password, you will receive notifications only if you are within the local area of the incident, which will be notified by the 911 Dispatch Center, and that will only to to your local land line, if you have one..

What if my phone number or email address changes?

The system is only as good as the information you provide. If your contact information changes, you can and should visit your profile and update your information.

Will my contact information be shared with others?

No. The information that you provide will be used only by Yakima County public safety for notification purposes. We will not give or sell your contact or location information to any vendor or other organization.
