Union Gap School Color Fun Run/Walk

May 7, 2020

Union Gap School District will be sponsoring a Color Fun Run/Walk. The map of the route is below. This activity is for Union Gap students/families to attend. We will be starting at 6:30 pm at the school, proceeding down 4th to California Street, back up 2nd Street to Columbus and end at the school football field.

Water soluble color will be "thrown" on participants throughout the route by school, fire and police personnel. The color is a powder and not liquid. The colors are made of cornstarch, baking soda, and FD&C (food safe) dyes. The majority of the "color" can be blown off clothing and then washed as normal to remove. If you are going to participate, consider wearing a bandana or hat as it could be a windy day and don't wear your new suede coat. The adults "throwing" the color will be wearing reflective vests. If they are stationed near your home and you would like them to "move" during the event, just politely let them know.

This **FREE** service is for Union Gap residents only. The disposal sites are for yard waste only; if your waste is bagged, you will be asked to remove the bags prior to dumping into the disposal containers.

Careful What You Flush!

Your wastewater discharge is collected in a lift station; the lift station is then pumped to a transfer facility. We have experiencing plugged lines in some areas – please help us avoid unnecessary wastewater discharge issues.

Possibly the biggest "no-no" to pour down the drains would be **used motor oil**. It is actually illegal in most municipalities, because of how much environmental damage it does and how easily it can contaminate an area's soil and water table. If you change your own oil in your car, **NEVER** pour used motor oil down a drain in your house, garage, sewer, storm drain in the street, manhole on a sidewalk, alley, street or on the ground. The basic rule for pouring motor oil is that it cannot be poured into anything at all. Please check with a local retailer that sells oil products on ways to recycle.

The only things you should ever flush down the toilet are: toilet paper, urine and fecal matter. Items marketed as "disposable" are to be disposed of in the garbage can with the rest of your solid waste. Please do not flush any disposable items; this includes disposable mop pads, mop heads, diapers, facial wipes, etc. If you have any questions, please call Public Works & Community Development Department at 509.225.3524.

KEEP YOUR STREET LIGHT WORKING

Please report any/all inoperable streetlight to the Public Works Administration Office at 225.3524. To help expedite the repair, it would be helpful to provide the address closest to the pole and the pole number if possible. Help us keep Union Gap safe and well-lit.

There is an online bill-pay website that appears to be affiliated with the City of Union Gap, **but it is not**. Doxo.com is a third-party website that allows people to pay their utility bills via their site. However, doxo. com may charge customers extra fees, and the City of Union Gap cannot control when we will receive the payments from doxo.com, possibly resulting in a late payment or service interruption if payment is not received on time.

As a reminder, the City of Union Gap offers its own online bill-pay website, **<u>www.xpressbillpay.com</u>**. We strongly urge customers interested in paying their bills online to use the City's bill-pay website to ensure direct and timely payments.



SPRING HAS OFFICIALLY SPRUNG!

While trimming trees, mowing lawns and planting flowers please be mindful of the following. While fertilizers and sprays promote healthy plants and beautiful yards they are also full of chemicals that are not only harmful to yourself; but also to the Storm Water Quality Management Program (SWQMP).

Stormwater drains need to be kept clear of lawn clippings, leaves, and garbage; by doing so you are helping to keep them clear and limiting the chances of flooding in your yards and/or home. Stormwater drains are not processed like sewer system – drain flows directly into our riverbeds and local streams without a sanitization process. By limiting the amount of fertilizer and/or the number of times you fertilize your yard, you can contribute to a safer environment for all. A great alternative to fertilizer is lawn mulch - one lawn mulching session is equivalent to one treatment of store bought fertilizer. With your help we can work together to create a healthier environment by using the above tips.

Remember, we are the solution to stormwater pollution!

Most of us have heard that you should not pour cooking Fats, Oils and Grease (F.O.G.) down the drain at one time or another, but is it true or is it just another myth?

The quick answer is that it is 'true' that you shouldn't pour grease and oils down your sinks and toilets, but why shouldn't you and what should you do to dispose of your unwanted cooking greases, fats and oils?

When F.O.G. is poured down the drain it coats your houses sewer pipes with layers of sticky grease. This can lead to expensive and repetitive plumber calls. Over time and numerous pours down the sink or toilet, layers form in and can completely plug up your pipes over time. Even though you pour it down the sink or toilet it can lead to water backing up and flowing into any downstream water fixtures in your home (eg. Bath tubs, showers, sinks etc.). Even if you do manage to get most of it down the drain and into the sewer main lines. The same process takes place there, except it is larger and can affect your neighbors' homes and businesses too.

The best way to dispose of F.O.G. is dump it in a container that can then be disposed of in the garbage. You can reuse a disposable container to pour or scrape the unwanted F.O.G. into or let it solidify after cooking and scrape it right into the garbage can.

The proper disposal of F.O.G. can save you time money and the hassle of dealing with a problem that is preventable. So take the extra steps and help keep your pipes clean!

*After normal business hours, week-ends, and holidays the Police Department transfers their business line to SUNCOMM Communications - the 911 call center for Yakima County and dispatch for the Union Gap and Yakima Police Departments.
