

IS YOUR DOG LICENSED?

Section 6.04.110 of the Union Gap Municipal Code states the following:

All dogs three (3) months of age or older are required to be licensed under this chapter.

- a. Tags. The police department shall issue animal licenses consisting of a metal tag with a number corresponding to the number of the application to the applicant. The applicant is required to cause the tag to be attached or fixed to the animal. The tag is not transferable. The absence of the license tag on a dog's collar shall be prima facie evidence that said dog has not been legally licensed.
- b. Fees. The following fees shall be paid for licenses required under this chapter:
 1. Spayed or neutered dogs that have current vaccinations and with a veterinarian's certificate: ten dollars (\$10.00) annually.
 2. Un-spayed, unneutered, or unvaccinated dogs, or dogs not current on vaccinations: thirty dollars (\$30.00) annually.
 3. Licenses shall be valid from January 1st to the following December 31st. For other than first time owners of a specific dog, licenses purchased after April 30th of any year shall be subject to an additional fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each license.

WORK ZONE SAFETY

A reminder to all...anytime you are on the roadway as a driver, a passenger OR you are performing construction in a work zone – everyone must be attentive and not distracted. Work crews AND the driving public are all at risk in construction work zones. Remember, individuals on the road are spouses, parents, children, siblings, friends, **human beings** – and everyone deserves to **ARRIVE ALIVE** at their destination.

We ask all drivers in work zones to:


- Slow down – drive the posted speeds, they are there for your safety.
- Be kind – our workers are out there helping to keep you safe and improve the roadways.
- Pay attention – both to workers directing you and surrounding traffic; put your phone down when behind the wheel.
- Stay calm – expect delays, leave early or take an alternate route if possible; no meeting or appointment is worth risking someone's life.



FREE "Spring Clean-Up" - CITY OF UNION GAP

On Saturday, May 11 2024, from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm, the City of Union Gap and Basin Disposal will be sponsoring the Annual "Spring Clean-Up" program. There will be **four (4) disposal sites**, set-up throughout the City, for residents to dispose of their yard waste.

The site locations are as follows:

- Fire Station parking lot @ 107 West Ahtanum Road
- Ray's Wholesale Meats parking lot @ 2112 South 3rd Avenue
- Cahalan Park parking lot @ 2100 South 18th Street
- Loudon Park parking area @ 3607 4th Street

This **FREE** service is for Union Gap residents only. The disposal sites are for **yard waste only**; if your waste is bagged, you will be asked to remove the bags prior to dumping into the disposal containers. The City is unable to assist in bagging yard waste. However, we would like to encourage disabled residents and senior citizens to contact us for assistance in **hauling** your bagged yard waste to the disposal sites.




Spring is on the Way...

While preparing your yard for the spring & summer seasons, please be mindful of the following. While fertilizers and sprays promote healthy plants and beautiful yards they are also full of chemicals that are not only harmful to yourself; but also to the Storm Water Quality Management Program (SWQMP). Stormwater drains should be kept clear of lawn clippings, leaves and garbage to help keep them clear and limiting the chances of flooding in your yards and/or home.

Stormwater drains are not processed like a sewer system – drain flows directly into our riverbeds and local streams without a sanitization process. By limiting the amount of fertilizer used, you can contribute to a safer environment for all. A great alternative to fertilizer is lawn mulch - one lawn mulching session is equivalent to one treatment of store bought fertilizer. With your help we can work together to create a healthier environment. Remember, we are the solution to stormwater pollution!

CITY OF UNION GAP HYDRANT FLUSHING PROGRAM - 2024

During the warmer months, the City will be conducting our annual hydrant flushing program. The program includes flushing a low dose of chlorine into the system and systematically flushing the lines to remove/clean the water lines. We will let you know when the dates have been determined - please check out the next newsletter for more information.




CAREFUL WHAT YOU FLUSH!

Your wastewater discharge is collected in a lift station; the lift station is then pumped to a transfer facility. We have experienced plugged lines in some areas – please help us avoid unnecessary wastewater discharge issues.

Possibly the biggest "no-no" to pour down the drains would be **used motor oil**. It is actually illegal in most municipalities, because of how much environmental damage it does and how easily it can contaminate an area's soil and water table. If you change your own oil in your car, **NEVER** pour used motor oil down a drain in your house, garage, sewer, storm drain in the street, manhole on a sidewalk, alley, street or on the ground. The basic rule for pouring motor oil is that it cannot be poured into anything at all. Please check with a local retailer that sells oil products on ways to recycle.

The only things you should ever flush down the toilet are: toilet paper and bodily waste. Items marketed as "disposable" are to be disposed of in the garbage can with the rest of your solid waste. Please do not flush any disposable items; this includes disposable mop pads, mop heads, diapers, facial wipes, etc. If you have any questions, please call Public Works & Community Development Department at 509.225.3524.



WHO TO CALL FOR ASSISTANCE?

EMERGENCY - 24 HOURS A DAY / 7 DAYS A WEEK: All life threatening emergencies - dial 911

AFTER NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS, WEEK-ENDS AND HOLIDAYS: All non-life threatening emergencies (i.e. water line breaks / sewer back-ups) - dial 509.248.0430*

DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS: All issues that can wait until normal business hours - dial the appropriate number listed on the back of this newsletter.

*After normal business hours, week-ends, and holidays the Police Department transfers their business line to SUNCOMM Communications - the 911 call center for Yakima County and dispatch for the Union Gap and Yakima Police Departments. If you do not get an answer right away, there is a good chance 911 is handling calls on their emergency lines and are unable to get to the non-emergency lines as quickly as normal.
